We are immensely grateful to our funders, partners, and members for their continued support. Your contributions have been integral to our success, and we are committed to upholding the highest standards


of financial stewardship moving forward. With your continued support, ConnectGroups will remain well-positioned to thrive, meet future challenges, and achieve its goals in the year ahead.


